ABOUT OUR FOUNDER



EDUCATION PROGRAMS



WHY DO WE OFFER EDUCATION PROGRAMS?

In addition to helping sick, injured, and abandoned wildlife, we run education programs that help our community learn about these amazing animals. With every program we run, we hope to educate people about these fantastic animals and foster an appreciation for our local wildlife.

WHAT MAKES OUR PROGRAMS DIFFERENT?

Most people have never had the opportunity to meet wildlife in a safe, educational environment. Our ambassador program provides a unique experience to meet wildlife up close and personal.

WHY SHOULD YOU BOOK A PROGRAM WITH US?

When you book an education program with us, you are not only getting a fun and exciting learning experience but also directly supporting our rehabilitation efforts. Wildlife rehabilitators do not receive any federal or state funding and operate entirely from the money received through donations and education programs. Any money we make from our education programs goes back into helping animals in need. This helps provide for food, medical treatments, surgery, housing, and more.

WHO LEADS THE PROGRAMS?

Our educators are RRWC staff and volunteers who are passionate about wildlife and desire to share their knowledge with others. All educators are trained to handle our animal ambassadors and deliver the programs with safety and quality in mind. Before volunteering with RRWC, all volunteers must pass PA's Child Abuse History Clearance and PA's State Police Criminal Background Check.

MEET THE ANIMAL AMBASSADORS

Due to injury or imprinting on humans, some animals that Raven Ridge rehabilitates are considered "unreleasable." This means they can no longer survive in the wild on their own.

Because every animal deserves a second chance, these patients become permanent residents of Raven Ridge, and some even become ambassadors!



PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS



No matter what you'd like to learn about, Raven Ridge has a program to suit your needs. We offer a variety of programs tailored to every age group.

PROGRAMS FOR ALL ACES

These are our most popular programs that are suitable for a variety of audiences and events.

PENNSYLVANIA'S WILDLIFE

Pennsylvania is full of beautiful mountains, valleys, and rivers filled with beautiful creatures. This program will serve as an introduction to wildlife native to Pennsylvania and the Mid-Atlantic region, featuring animal ambassadors from a variety of species and habitats.

Program Length: 1 hour Cost: \$300

BIRDS OF PREY

Hawks, Owls, Falcons, oh my! This program focuses on the fantastic predators of the sky. Learn what makes these birds unique and how they are built for hunting. With help from some of our ambassadors, get up close and personal with these fascinating creatures.

OWLS AND OWL PELLETS

Learn about the night's fiercest predator! Meet some of our owl ambassadors and learn what makes an owl different from their daytime cousins. Then dissect an owl pellet from the Center's owl residents to discover what that owl ate for dinner.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS



ANIMAL SENSORY EXPLORATION

Young learners will embark on the ultimate sensory experience as they learn about Pennsylvania's native wildlife. Using our collection of pelts, skulls, and other fun supplies, groups will learn the essential characteristics of common animals they might see out in the wild.

Program Length: 45 minutes

Group Size: 20 students + chaperones

Cost: \$250

WILDLIFE THROUGH THE SEASONS

Living in Pennsylvania means experiencing the beauty of all four seasons. In these programs, young learners will explore how animals' behavior changes throughout the year. They will learn how they prepare for winter or how they stay busy in the summer. This program has one lesson designed for each of the four seasons. Book one lesson or all four throughout the year for the whole experience!

Program Length: 45 minutes

Group Size: 20 students + chaperones

Cost: \$250 for 1 lesson or \$850 for all four lessons

WILDLIFE DETECTIVES

Put your detective skills to the test! Using our collection of skulls, pelts, and other animal specimens, the students will become detectives and solve a mystery at the wildlife center.

LIVING WITH WILDLIFE

Education concerning the natural world increases our understanding, tolerance, and appreciation for wildlife. Conflicts are bound to occur in many backyards, parks, and other outdoor spaces where people and wildlife meet. This program breaks down common myths, fears, and concerns that people have when interacting with wildlife and provides humane and caring solutions that allow both humans and wildlife to coexist and thrive.

BOOKING A PROGRAM

Once you pick a program that fits your interests and age group, you need to consider some additional items before booking a program.

PROGRAM POLICIES

Cost, Payment, and Cancelation/Refund Policies

All program fees and lengths are listed under each description. Multiple programs can be booked on the same day, but please be aware that some restrictions may apply. When booking multiple programs on the same day, each subsequent program booked after the first will receive a discount on the standard program fee. Payment must be provided before or at the time of the program. All programs must be booked at least 1 month before your desired program date. Cancellations made up to 24 hours before a program will be processed without a penalty. If RRWC cancels a program for any reason, programs may be rescheduled, or a full refund will be provided.

Travel, Time & Space Requirements

RRWC will travel up to 20 miles from Washington Boro, PA, at no additional charge. Any program further than 20 miles will be charged for the additional mileage at the IRS standard mileage rate. All programs will be scheduled between 9 am and 6 pm. Any programs outside of this time frame will be considered on a case-by-case basis. RRWC staff and volunteers will need access to the event space 30 minutes before the program to set up and 30 minutes after the program concludes to pack up. Programs can be held indoors or outdoors with appropriate cover for rain and extreme temperatures. Groups are asked to provide off-street parking close to the event location for one RRWC vehicle.

Youth Supervision

RRWC's main responsibility is to the animal ambassadors and their equipment. All programs for those under 18 must provide the appropriate number of chaperones, who must remain with the group for the duration of the program. RRWC staff and volunteers are not to be left alone with youth at any point during the program.

Animal Ambassador Policies

Due to insurance/liability and PA Game Commission restrictions, the public is not permitted to have any physical contact with any animal ambassadors during the program. This ensures the safety of both the animals and the participants. Not all education programs offered include bringing an animal ambassador. Not all animal ambassadors will be at each education program. RRWC will bring the appropriate quantity and species of animals depending on the topic and setting of the program. RRWC staff and volunteers have the right to contain or remove an animal ambassador from a program due to any situation that may cause the animal unnecessary stress. This could be due to participant behavior, noise level, animal behavior, environmental factors, or any other reason deemed appropriate by RRWC staff and volunteers.
